

## Instructions

For our midterm review, you will create and present **either a meme or a 30-60 second TikTok** on a film screened in class. Your meme / TikTok must capture themes discussed in class (masculinity, virility, male crises, etc.). You may choose the film/ film protagonist you would like to present on within your group of. However, you may not present on the same film/ film protagonist of your scene analysis. If you decide to use TikTok, you will either need to make your video public or download a copy of your video that can be submitted on Blackboard.

In addition to creating a meme/ TikTok you must submit a 200-250 word explanation of your meme/ TikTok. Be sure to reference class readings and discussions and use two film terms in your explanation. You'll share your meme/ TikTok in class and submit it on Blackboard.
